OVERVIEW

Reconciliation is central to the Catholic faith and Catholic tradition. Mary MacKillop was always forgiving of others and she lived her life as a person of compassion through her thoughts, words and actions.

ACTIVITIES

Students will:

- listen to events in Mary MacKillop's life that showed her compassion and mercy towards others in her ministry;
- engage in tasks related to Reconciliation role playing situations that show a change of heart;
- pray in the chapel where Mary prayed; and
- practise genuflecting, making the sign of the Cross and reflecting on the symbols and meaning of Reconciliation.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

By the conclusion of this program students will have:

- Knowledge of Mary MacKillop and the meaning of compassion
- Identified everyday situations involving positive and negative choices and the impact of their decisions and the role of the Sacrament of Reconciliation
- Knowledge of Reconciliation symbols and importance of the Sacrament of Reconciliation
